



Various Methods-<u>LMDG, Douglas Media &</u> <u>DMU</u>

- Disaster Dashboard One stop Information
- New water information (coming)
- Emergency news converts to Council text for subscribers (as required). Also email
- Social and Facebook for various agencies
- Facebook (Council and Douglas Disaster Information)
- Website
- Emails (Ferry group, TPDD network)
- Australian Warning System
- Media (circulating papers, radio, pamphlets, banners, fridge magnets, publications)
- Current method of regular road updates outside of Dashboard Map
- Emergency Alerts (LDC only) State approval to mobile and landlines
- Preservation of Life takes Priority always

Program of Works


- 20 packages of work for reconstruction
- Funded under "Reconstruction of Essential Public Assets" REPA
- Like for like funding arrangement (replace what was there, can't upgrade the road)
- \$150 \$200 Million program
- Activities until late 2025 (weather dependent)



- \$36 million in 'Emergent works'
 - Providing safe access
 - Removal of debris and landslide material
 - Emergency repairs of road and pavement failures
- \$38 million of Reconstruction contracts awarded
- All 13 landslip repairs across Alexandra Range are under contract

- After completion waiting time: ~10min














- Estimate Progress Completion: 21/Feb/2025 AR Site 3b, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8
- Estimate Progress Completion: 19/Mar/2025
- Once complete, road restriction 5am till midnight will be lifted

Noah Creek Heavy Vehicle Bypass

- For heavy vehicles only
- Being strengthened for wet season

Noah Bridge

- Will remain in place throughout the wet season
- 16 tonnes load limit
- Regular inspection and survey
- Replacement next dry season



Noah Slip





Noah Slip

- Controlled removal of upslope material has commenced
- Trigger Action Plan in place if uncontrolled movements occur:
 - Comms, resources, plant and equipment, disposal sites
- Priority is removal of material, road following

CTBR

- Maintenance works throughout the wet season
- Reconstruction next year of road and landslips
- Safety audit completed
